IPB ICM project:

What for?

The major aim of the IPB's International Credit Mobility (ICM) project is:

- a) to promote student mobility for **double diploma**;
- b) to promote **staff development** on the European HE best-practices;
- c) to improve partner HEIs' international relations capacities.







How?

What have we learned from the Erasmus mobility and the ECTS?

The golden rule of recognition of credit mobility: All credits gained during the period of study abroad should be **transferred** and counted towards the student's degree without any additional work by or assessment of the student.

Transfer of credits is the process of having credits awarded in **one context** (programme, institution) **recognised** in **another context** for the purpose of obtaining a qualification.

Credits awarded to students in **one programme** may be **transferred** from **an institution** to be **accumulated** in **another programme** offered by **another institution**.
